Baptisms

If you or a family member wishes to be Baptized, we can arrange for a Baptism during one of our Sunday morning services during our summer season, or a Private Baptism service. The recommended donations:

- Baptism during a Sunday 10 am Service, the fee is \$75 to St. Andrew's
- Private Baptism, the fee is \$150 to St. Andrew's
- All Baptisms, recommended donation to Priest is \$100 - 150, this may vary with individual clergy.

COVID-19 Limitations and Restrictions (it is the responsibility of the client to disseminate this information to wedding attendees and to enforce these COVID-19 Limitation and Restrictions)

- No person shall be present who feels ill or unwell.
- No person shall be present who has been in close contact with someone who is suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 in the past 14 days. (Health care workers using appropriate PPE may attend.)
- All persons over two-years old shall wear a facemask while on the grounds of St. Andrew's.
 - Parents, god-parents and minister use of facemask is optional.
 - Active readers may remove facemask but must maintain 6-ft separation from others.
- It is the responsibility of the CLIENT to provide facemasks and hand sanitizer.
- Chapel windows that can be opened must remain open.
- The Episcopal Church of New Hampshire offers the following criteria regarding when a wedding might be able to gather indoors. In order to consider gathering indoors, all three of these criteria need to be met, as reported on <https://www.covidactnow.org> for Rockingham County, this contract shall be void if these conditions are exceeded and deposit will be refunded (accommodations outdoors maybe possible):
 - Fewer than 5% of the people are positive for COVID-19
 - The rate of new cases per day is less than 10 in 100,000
 - ICU beds are filled to less than 70% of capacity

Six-foot separation from people outside the same household must be maintained at all times while in the chapel. This requires only using alternate pews.
